Preparation

Print the first four pages double-sided on thick-ish paper, and cut out the cards following the lines on the side with lines. I use 180g paper (check your specific printer's printing capabilities before buying paper)

****important note** - when printing a pdf file, you are often not able to select the print quality. So, if you just print using default settings, the quality may not be as good as desired. A way to fix this is to go into: Windows settings> click Devices> click Printers and scanners> then select the printer you wish to print on and click Manage> click Printing preferences. Here you can select a higher printing quality. This should allow you to print at a higher resolution. **

Instructions

First, divide the students into teams of three to five people (if there is an odd number of students, teams of different sizes can be used). Next, decide which team will start and choose a student from that team to sit on the hotseat, which is a seat placed at the front of the class facing the students. The student on the hotseat then selects a category card, and the teacher picks five words from the category to write on the board behind the student. To choose the words, the teacher can start on a certain number and then jump a certain number, such as starting on the second word and jumping three, resulting in the numbers 2, 5, 8, 11, and 14 being used.

After the words are chosen, the teacher starts a 30-45 second timer, and the student's teammates describe the words to the student in order. When the student guesses correctly or says "pass," the teammates move on to describing the next word. The aim of the game is to guess as many words as possible before the time runs out.

If your class is small, such as 3 or 4 students, you can play the game without teams. Each student takes turns coming up to the hotseat. This is just one of the many ways to use the cards. Feel free to use them in any way you see fit.
