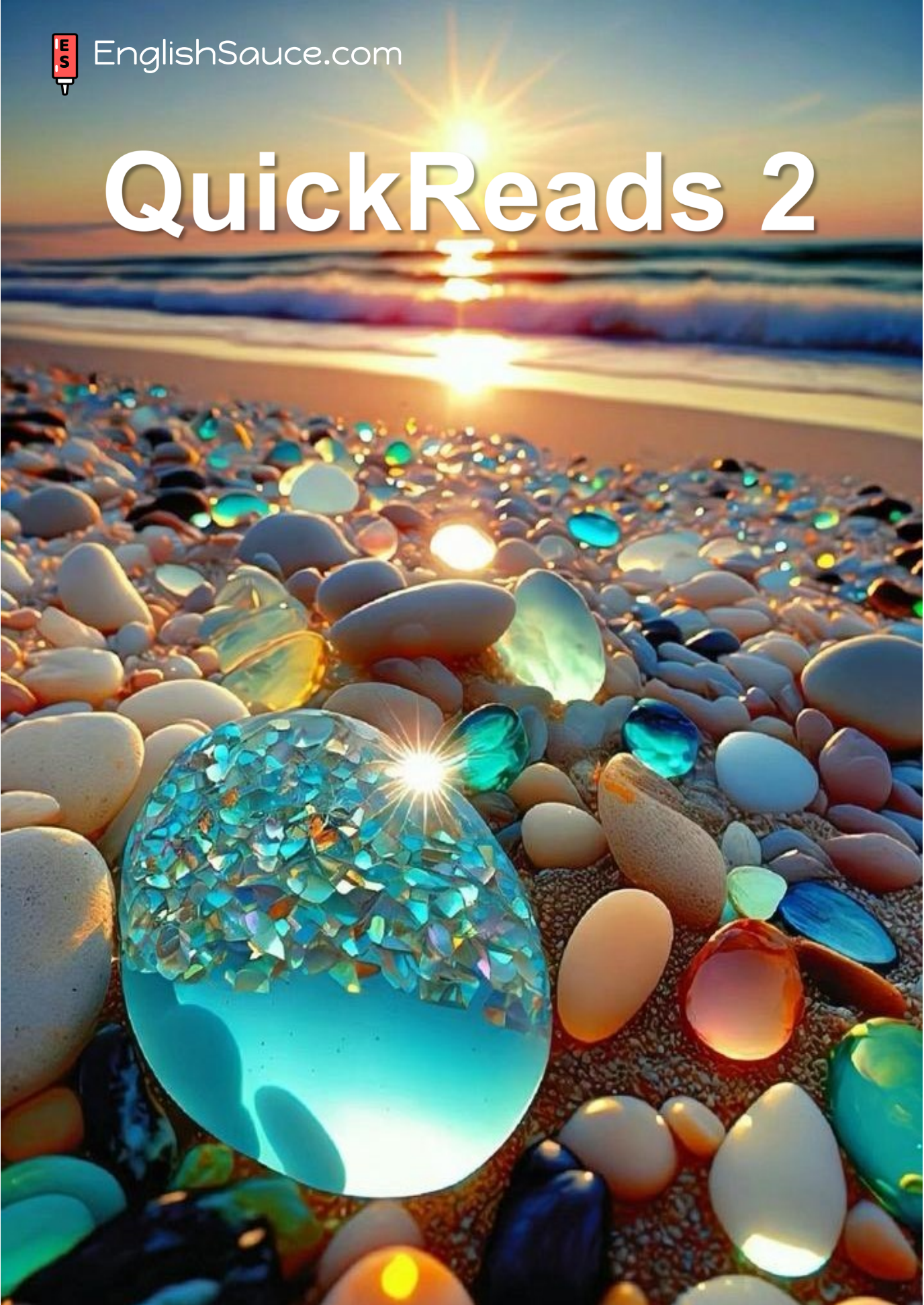

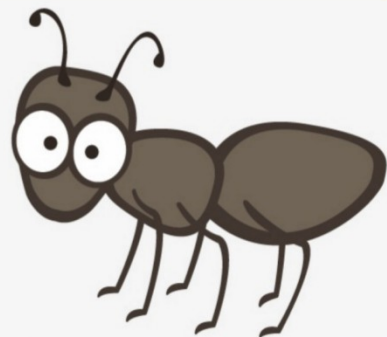
ANTS

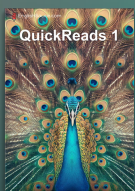
